**Brexit: competition and State aid**

As you will be aware, on 2 February 2018 the European Union Committee published a report titled *Brexit: competition and State aid*.<sup>1</sup> The report was the outcome of an inquiry conducted by the EU Internal Market Sub-Committee on key matters for the UK's post-Brexit competition and State aid regime. We are grateful for the CMA's oral and written contributions to the inquiry.

The report discussed in detail the implications of Brexit for the CMA as the UK's competition authority. Since publication of our report, it has become clear that the CMA will also become responsible for administering the UK's post-Brexit state aid regime.

Given that more than a year has passed since we published our report, we would be grateful if you could provide us with a comprehensive update on the CMA's preparations for its post-Brexit responsibilities, including details of its engagement with the devolved administrations and other relevant stakeholders.
