**Point of interest: More high-profile and controversial legislation tends to be introduced in the House of Commons. This legislation tends to attract more attention and interest in the Lords too. This likely explains why more amendments tend to be tabled against Commons-starting Bills than against Lords-starting Bills.**

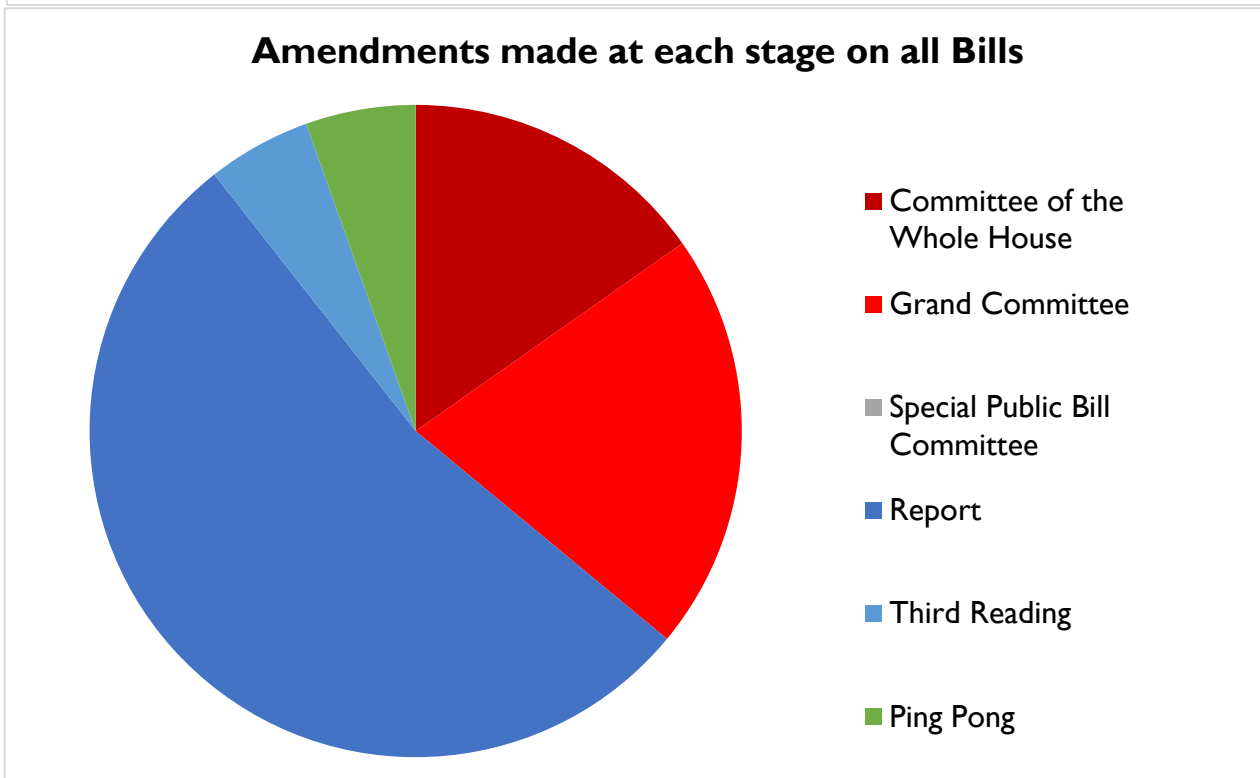
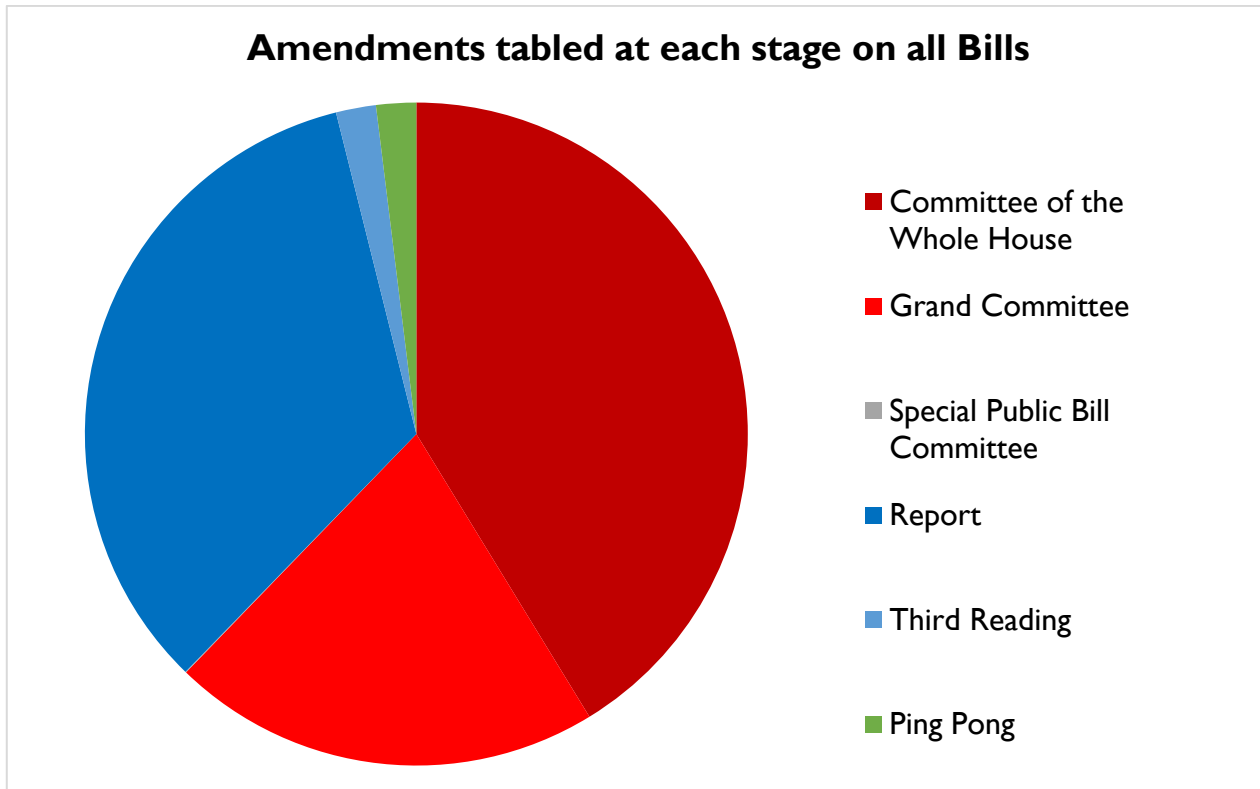

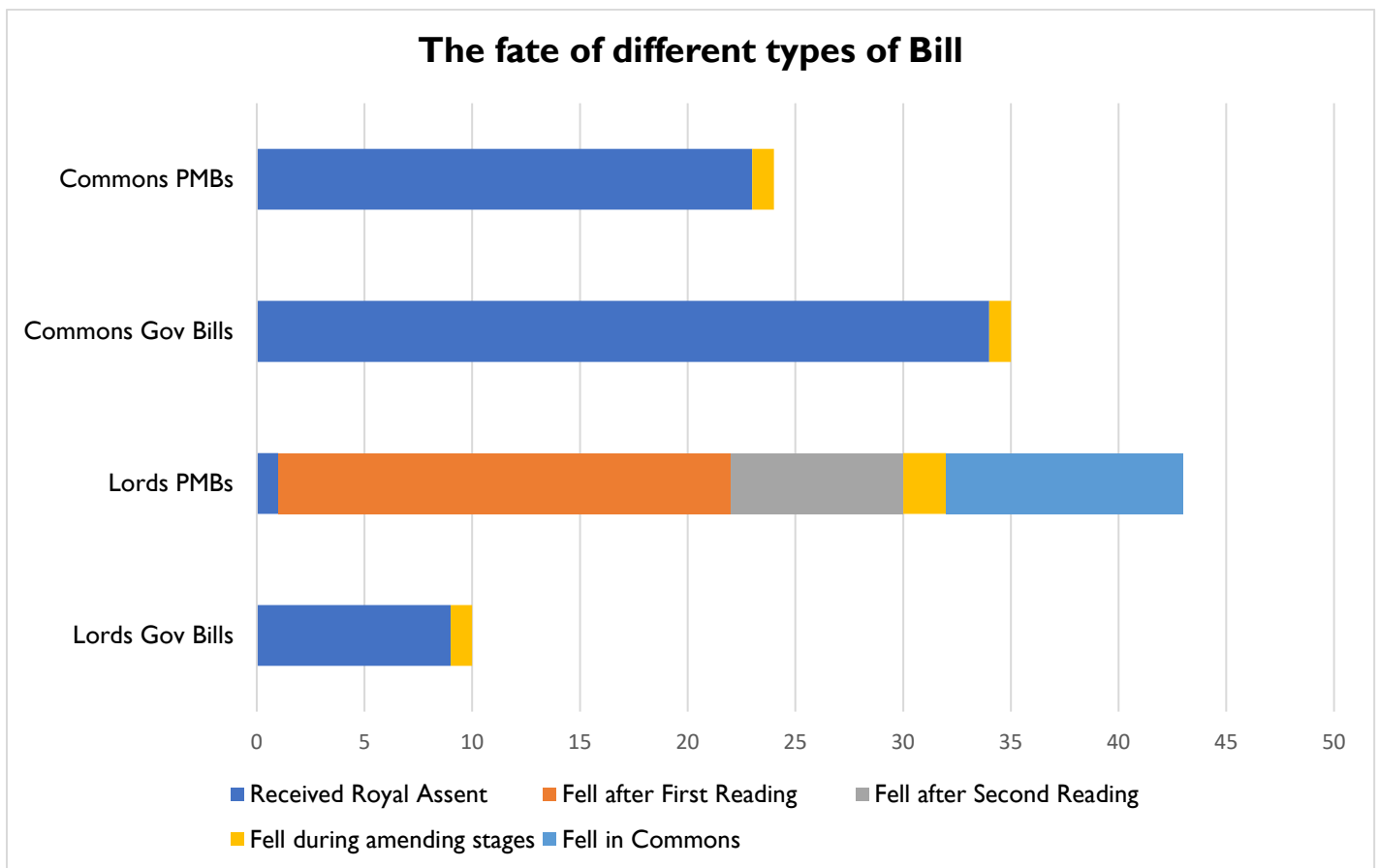
