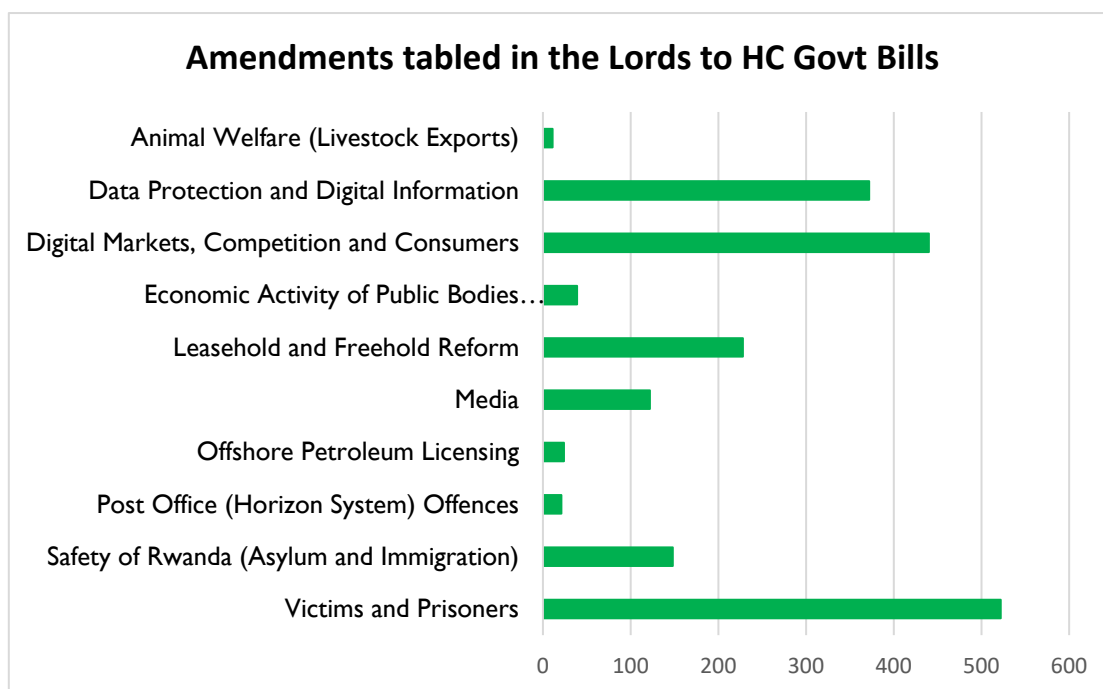

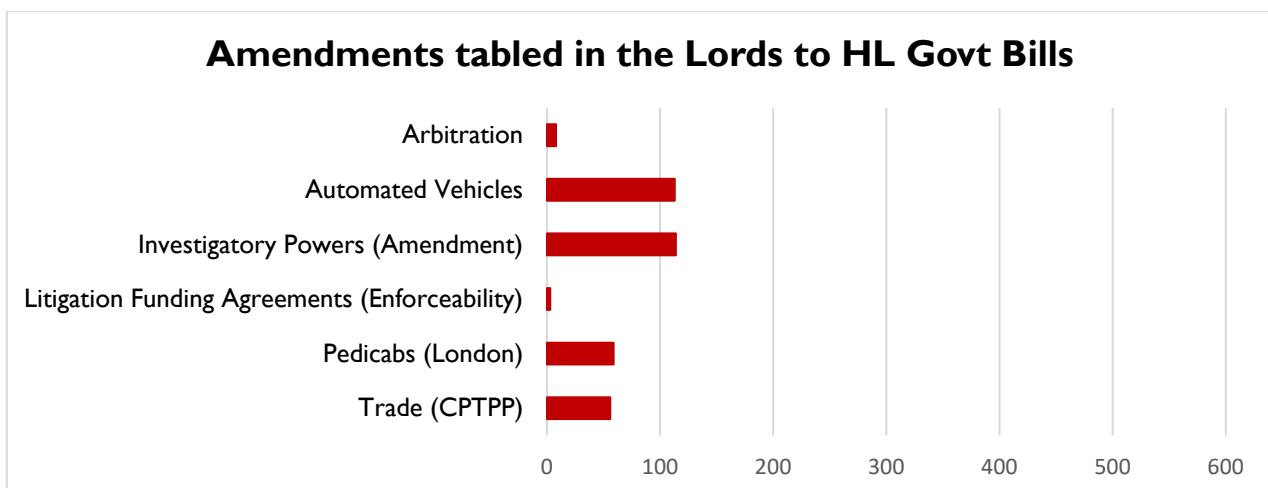

Point of interest: More high-profile and controversial legislation tends to be introduced in the House of Commons. This legislation tends to attract more attention and interest in the Lords too. This likely explains why more amendments tend to be tabled against Commons-starting Bills than against Lords-starting Bills.

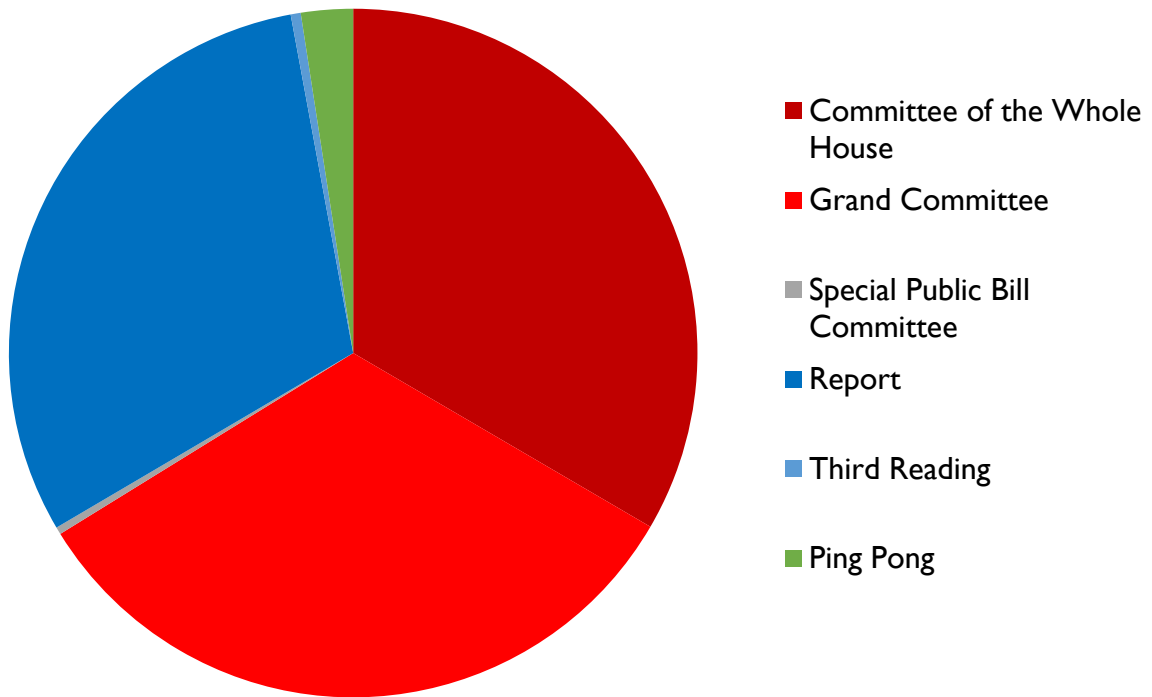

Amendments made at each stage on all Bills

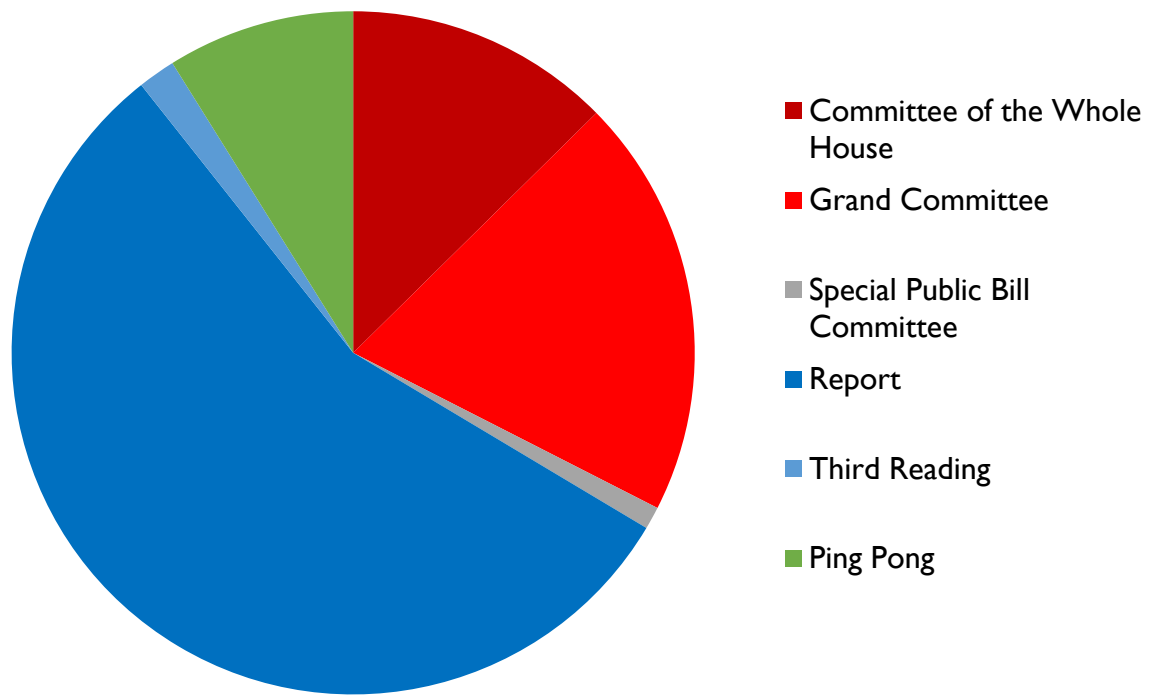

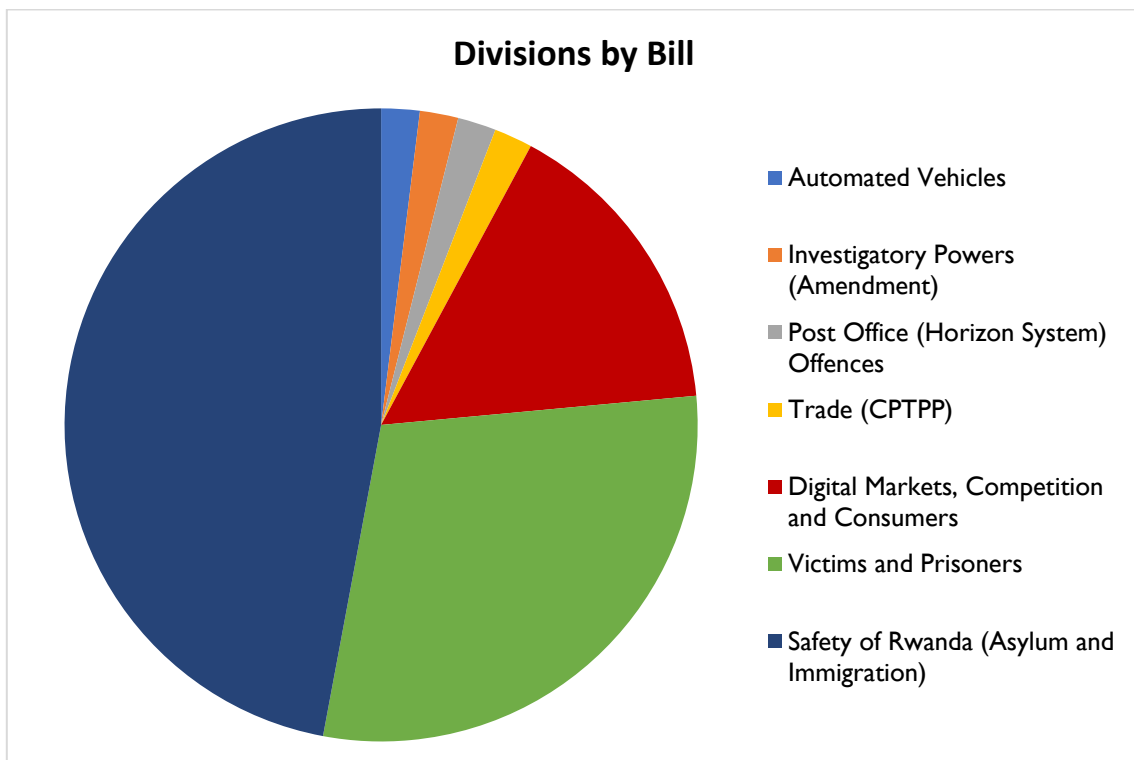

Point of interest: If an Opposition amendment is agreed in the Lords this tends to be the result of a Division resulting in a Government defeat. Therefore, it is interesting to look at whether such amendments are accepted or reversed by the Government using its majority in the Commons, whether amendments in lieu are offered, or whether another outcome is reached.

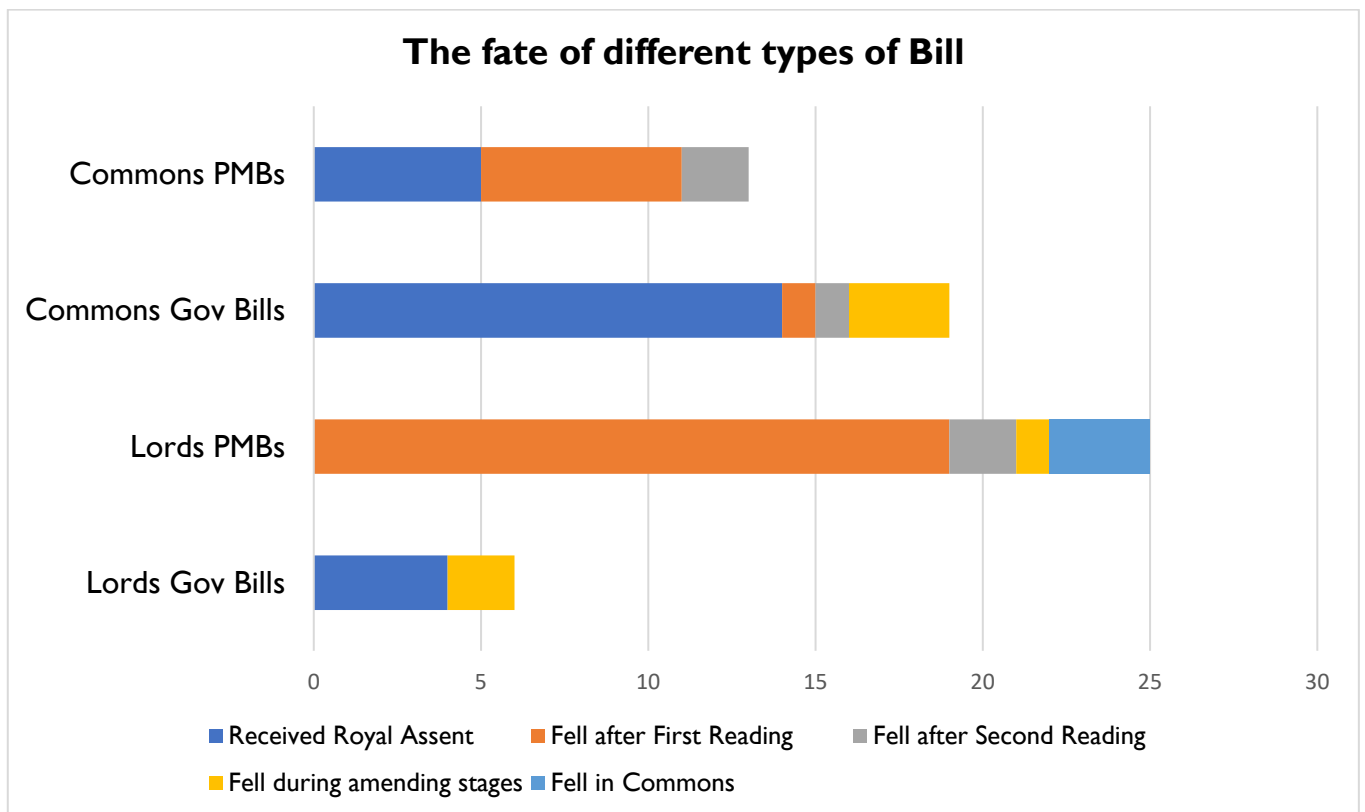
