Day-to-day Spending (Resource DEL)

DIT spends 0.1% of total Resource DEL


Spending Review 2015

The Department was only formed in 2016 so was not included in the 2015 Spending Review. Nevertheless the department has previously been set a control total for 2018-19 – this has been revised up by £16 million as a result of budget transfers from other departments.

Trends (RDEL)

Spending on DIT activities has increased since 2012-13 but the initial budget for 2018-19 is lower than 2017-18. This may increase at the Supplementary Estimates (see **Changes from last year (RDEL)** box)


Long-term spending trends (£m, nominal)

Changes from last year (RDEL)

- The initial RDEL budget is £37 million (9.5%) lower than last year.
- However in [March 2018](#) HM Treasury announced £74 million of planned additional EU exit preparation funds to DIT for 2018-19. If DIT receives this funding at the Supplementary Estimates as expected, it will mean DIT's RDEL budget for 2018-19 will be £428 million, a £37 million *increase* (9.4%) compared to the £391 million of 2017-18.

Investment Spending (Capital DEL)


DIT spends 0.006% of total Capital DEL

DIT's initial CDEL budget for 2018-19 is £3.5 million. This is a reduction on last year's budget of £19 million which had been increased by £12 million at the 2017-18 supplementary estimate.
